

The City of Weyburn and RM of Weyburn No. 67 are located on traditional lands, referred to as Treaty 4 Territory.

Treaty 4 territory is part of the orginial lands of the Nehiyawak (Cree), Nahkawe (Saulteaux), and Nakota and homeland of the Metis, Dakota and Lakota.

When Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the land in what is now western Canada, they negotiates the Numbered Treaties 1 - 11 with First Nations who held their traditional land on the prairies. The Nehiyawak, Nahkawe, and Nakota Nations had traditional lands in what is now Treaty 4 territory. There, when Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the lands in this area, they had to make treaty with Nehiyawak, Nahkawe, and Nakota Nations.

The Dakota, Lakota and Metis did not have traditional lands in this area when Treaty 4 was made, however, a number of Dakota, Lakota and Metis people were settled on these lands prior to and at the time Treaty 4 was made September 15, 1874, therefore, we acknowledge Treaty 4 as their homeland.

We respect and honour the Treaties that were made on all territories. We acknowledge the harms and mistakes of the past, and we are committed to moving forward in partnership with Indigenous Nations in the spirit of reconciliation and collaboration. We are all treaty people.

As the phrase "We are all treaty people" implies, both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in Saskatchewan are part of the treaty. Acknowledging territory and treaty shows recognition of and respect for Indigenous Peoples. It is recognition of their presence in our past, our present and in our future. Recognition and respect are essential elements of establishing and maintaining healthy, reciprocal relationships that are the key to reconcilation.







# 2.2 MANUFACTURING

Manufacturing plays a key role in Saskatchewan, making up 6.9% of the provincial GDP. In 2023 manufacturing shipments totals \$25.6 billion. Located in the heart of the Canadian Prairies, Saskatchewan is well positioned to meet the needs of numerous growing sectors within manufacturing. As well, the province's central location in North America, Saskatchewan manufacturers have access to markets to 270 million people within a one or two day drive. Weyburn is home to globally recognized manufacturers who export their products to varied customers around the world. From commercial concrete and steel fabrication to industrial cable, our local manufacturers use innovative and breakthrough technologies to meet their customer's growing needs.

# SASKATCHEWAN BUSINESS INCENTIVES

ECONOMIC SECTORS: The province has created a favourable business environment for manufacturers with many competitive advantages including: low corporate income tax for manufacturers and processors at 10%, as well as provincial tax exemptions for eligible machinery, equipment, and materials

# 2.3 OIL & GAS

Weyburn has been established as a central figure for the upstream oil industry in the province. Through investment in pioneering research projects and leading edge oil extraction technology, Weyburn based companies continue to advance innovation and development in the industry. The city's youthful professional culture and educated workforce has made Weyburn an attractive locale for many national and local industry headquarters and a strategic location for industry service.

**Bakken Formation:** Weyburn sits geographically atop the Bakken Oil Formation, which is one of the most prolific oil producing patches in the world. With new technology driving the industry, these once unattainable oil reserves are now fueling economic growth in the region. Weyburn based companies are some of the largest investors in the Canadian Bakken play.

Innovation: Carbon dioxide capture and storage is considered a critical technology to reduce world greenhouse gas emissions. Currently in the Weyburn region there are two commercial carbon dioxide enhanced oil recovery projects operated by Whitecap Resources and by Cardinal Energy Ltd.; the projects involve the capture of carbon dioxide and subsequent injection into underground rock formations. Most recent innovation in the Weyburn region is an established alternate renewal energy resource. DEEP is a Saskatchewan privately held corporation with a mission to develop SK's geothermal resources for power generation. They will harness high-quality geothermal resources with existing drilling and power generation technologies to establish a long-term renewable baseload power supply.

# WHITECAP RESOURCES INC.

Whitecap Resources "Weyburn Unit" property is located south of Weyburn, Saskatchewan. The Weyburn property is the largest Carbon Capture & Utilization Storage "CCUS" project in the world which underpins why Whitecap has one of the lowest emissions intensities in the world along with our commitment to continue to emphasize environmental sustainability as a core value. This internationally recognized, world class project has safely captured over 36 million tonnes of CO2. Since 2019, we have stored 2.0 million tonnes of CO2 per year in Weyburn which means we sequester more CO2 than our yearly corporate emissions (direct and indirect), making us a carbon negative company. Whitecap has a 65.3% operated working interest in the Weyburn Unit which produces primarily light oil. The Weyburn Unit has been in existence since the 1950's when it was discovered. Waterflood operations commenced in the 1960's with a world class CO2 enhanced oil recovery "EOR" development commencing in 2000. Whitecap's expertise in CO2 EOR and sequestration provides the foundation to continue to drive down Whitecap's GHG emissions intensity.

- The small business income tax rate for Canadian-controlled private corporations is 2% and applies to the first \$600,000 of business income.
- Of the Canadian provinces with a provincial sales tax, SK's rate of 6% is the lowest.
- SK does not charge a payroll tax for employers, and there are no health premiums levied.
- SK has a refundable 10% tax credit for scientific research and development expenditures.
- SK has a number of business incentives & tax credits available to encourage business growth, investment, and innovation in SK.



# Roads



# Rails


# River Park Campground
